## STATEMENT FROM THE PREMIER

Jill Hennessy has announced that she will step back from her ministerial role as Attorney-General, effective today.

Every day in these jobs is a balancing act between your public life and your private life. And I know this year, with all of its many challenges, has seen many families reassessing what the right balance looks like for them.

In making this decision, Jill has made a courageous choice. Based on our conversations over recent times, I also know it is the right choice – for her and for her family – and she has my full support.

From the very beginning of our Government, Jill has been a valued member of our Cabinet, serving first as Minister for Health and Ambulance Services before taking on the portfolios of Attorney-General and, until recently, Workplace Safety.
