BARMAH NATIONAL PARK JOINT MANAGEMENT PLAN LAUNCHED

A significant milestone in recognising the rights of the Yorta Yorta Traditional Owners in caring for country was reached today, with the launch of a Joint Management Plan for Barmah National Park.

Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, Lily D'Ambrosio announced the plan between the Andrews Labor Government, the Yorta Yorta Nation Aboriginal Corporation and the Yorta Yorta Traditional Owner Land Management Board.

The plan symbolises the growing partnership between the Government and Traditional Owners in managing the state's parks and reserves.

The plan's vision for the park is 'Heal the Land, Heal the People – Healthy Country'. It recognises the Yorta Yorta's traditional ownership and custodial rights in a new era of self-determination and equal partnership in decisions, responsibilities and management.

This is Victoria's third Joint Management Plan and involves Yorta Yorta working with the Government to manage the natural and cultural values of Barmah National Park.

To help implement the plan, the Government provided more than \$1.3 million to employ four Yorta Yorta Joint Management Rangers and on-ground works.

The Government has also provided more than \$3.4 million for renovations to the Dharnya Centre. Construction of a conference facility with meeting rooms and an industrial kitchen, group accommodation, site manager's house and landscaping is expected to be completed by July 2022.
