## CHANGES TO RESTRICTIONS FROM 11.59PM TUESDAY 27 JULY

Note: Cleaning, signage, record keeping, and other COVIDSafe requirements continue to apply for all venues and facilities with onsite operations as per Workplace Directions. The Density Quotient (DQ) applies to all venues and spaces that are accessible to the public (and in closed workplaces, to shared spaces such as lunchrooms).

	Higher education and training: If you can study from home, you should continue to study from home.
Ceremonies and Religious Gatherings	<ul> <li>Religious gatherings and ceremonies: Permitted for up to 100 people indoors and up to 300 people outdoors.</li> <li>Density quotient of 1 person per 4 sqm applies.</li> <li>A venue smaller than 100sqm can have up to 25 people per venue before density quotient applies.</li> <li>COVID Check-in Marshals must ensure attendees check-in.</li> </ul>

Accommodation	Accommodation: Open. Bookings permitted for single households, intimate partners or single bubbles.
Real Estate Services	<b>Inspections and auctions:</b> Auctions permitted with a maximum patron cap of 100 people indoors or outdoors. Inspections permitted with a private appointment, to a maximum of 10 people, subject to density quotient of 1 person per 4sqm. COVID Check-in Marshals must ensure attendees check-in.
