SALONS REGROWTH: MORE HAIRDRESSERS MAKING THE CUT

More hairdressers will soon be in salons across the state to meet the growing demand for tresses to be trimmed, treated and coloured thanks to the Andrews Labor Government.

Minister for Employment Jaala Pulford today visited Ohana Salon in Collingwood where owner Olivia Zynevych has taken on a recruit under the program – a partnership between Jobs Victoria and Box Hill Institute that will create 75 ongoing and secure hairdressing jobs for women over 45, young people and long-term jobseekers.

It's a win-win as jobseekers embark on a new start and the industry gains enthusiastic workers, including hairdresser Chiara Perrone, 26, who suffered an injury prior to the pandemic which forced her to take a break from the profession and work.

The program has provided Ms Perrone with support and mentorship from Ms Zynevych, who has praised her new worker for the skills and enthusiasm she has brought to the salon.

As the industry reopens and demand for stylists and makeovers increases, the initiative will see aspiring hairdressers complete two weeks of training before starting work – in time for summer and the celebration season.

The hairdressers will continue to learn as they earn, studying a Certificate III qualification in either hairdressing or barbering while receiving on-the-job support and skills development.

The initiative is supported by the \$250 million *Jobs Victoria Fund*, which is creating 10,000 steady and secure jobs for those people most impacted by the pandemic.

Jobs Victoria works with employers in sectors with workforce demand to create jobs, then supports people looking for work to secure and train for the new roles.
