## **ELECTIVE SURGERY INCREASES FOR REGIONAL AND PRIVATE HOSPITALS**

Public hospitals in Ballarat, Bendigo, Shepparton and the Latrobe Valley can resume up to 50 per cent of normal elective surgery from Monday 29 November, as Victoria continues to safely manage COVID-19 hospital admissions.

Private hospitals and day procedure centres currently operating up to 50 per cent of elective surgery capacity will be able to move up to 75 per cent from Monday 29 November, so long as they continue to first assist with the COVID-19 response.

Rural and regional health services not operating major COVID streaming sites have generally continued all categories of elective surgery, only postponing non-urgent surgery in response to local outbreaks.

At an operational level, health services will still have the option to reduce non-urgent surgery, if deemed necessary due to challenges associated with the pandemic.

Major metropolitan public hospitals and Barwon Health will continue to provide urgent elective surgery and emergency surgery only. This ensures adequate capacity within the health system is retained to care for patients with COVID-19 requiring hospitalisation, including ICU admission and sustain other critical services.

With high vaccination rates across Victoria, the number of COVID-19 patients requiring hospitalisation has reduced and stabilised – meaning our health services can cautiously increase elective surgery capacity.

The situation will continue to be monitored closely to ensure there is capacity available in the system in case hospitalisations surge.

Further increases to elective surgery capacity will be considered in the coming weeks – and will be announced when it is safe to do so.

Health services are also carefully managing the wellbeing of staff to ensure our dedicated frontline workers are rested and supported as regular non-COVID activity increases.
