CODE BREAKERS PAVE THE WAY FOR MORE WOMEN IN TECH

The Andrews Labor Government is supporting gender diversity in key digital technology jobs, encouraging the continued growth of career opportunities for women.

An essential part of any digital service is the coding that sits beneath it – and social enterprise Code Like a Girl supports girls and women looking to build rewarding careers in what has traditionally been a male-dominated field.

Paid internships is a key initiative of Code Like a Girl, providing professional experience in a range of environments, enabling participants to contribute to live projects and build skills that can only be learned on the job.

The Labor Government has joined with Code Like a Girl to deliver five paid internships within government departments as part of a pilot program for women passionate about coding.

The program will also provide women in the public service with an intensive four-month course with Code Like a Girl's School of Code – which turns participants with no coding knowledge into junior web developers.

Current statistics illustrate why Code Like a Girls' work and the Government's new training and internship programs are so essential, with women only making up 31 per cent of Victoria's digital technology workforce the program will increase diversity and representation across the sector.

Lack of diversity in Cyber Security is even more pronounced with less than one in five Cyber Security workers being women. That is why the Government is also partnering with the Australian Women in Security Network to deliver a pilot training course for 26 women currently working in the tech sector.

Part of the *Digital Strategy 2021-26*, the Government has partnered with Microsoft and RMIT to deliver digital course content, so the Victorian Public Service have the digital skills they need for the future.

Victoria's wider tech sector is a major jobs provider and driver of business activity – it contributes more than \$38 billion to the economy annually and supports almost 140,000 workers across 20,000 businesses.
