COMMONWEALTH GAMES FEVER BUILDS

Let the excitement begin, with our athletes set off to show their stuff in Birmingham as the Commonwealth Games begins.

Victoria has more than 80 members joining the Australian contingent, with 15 athletes coming from regional Victoria, which will be the home of the games in 2026.

The 2026 Commonwealth Games will be held from March 17-29 and will deliver a unique model of Games – not centred around one city. Instead, four regional hubs will be established in Geelong, Bendigo, Ballarat and Gippsland, each with their own athletes' village and sports program.

It is estimated the Games will contribute more than \$3 billion to Victoria's economy, creating more than 600 fulltime equivalent jobs before the Games, 3,900 jobs during the Games and a further 3,000 jobs beyond the Closing Ceremony.

Victoria 2026 will also invest significantly in community infrastructure, including housing and world-class sports facilities. This will leave a legacy of affordable housing for the regions and modern sports infrastructure to encourage Victorians to get active and attract future major events.

Victoria will be on show to the world during the handover ceremony at the end of the games.

Regional communities are also encouraged to submit their ideas on how their local town could be showcased during the games.

The process is open to local residents and businesses, Traditional Owner groups, creative and cultural organisations and local councils and closes on August 12.
