PARTNERSHIP RESTORES MINERAL SPRINGS IN HEPBURN

The historic Deep Creek Mineral Springs are flowing again thanks to a partnership between Dja Dja Wurrung Traditional Owners and the Andrews Labor Government.

Minister for Environment and Climate Action Lily D'Ambrosio today officially opened the new spring, near Eganstown in Hepburn Shire, at a joint ceremony with Traditional Owners.

The \$200,000 upgrade funded as part of the Mineral Spring Reserves Grants Program includes a new spring bore and pump for visitors to taste and collect the spring water, along with new seating and track works to make the reserve more accessible.

New rock wall seating, landscaping and welcome signage – completed by Djaara contractors Djandak – have created a more inclusive environment for people of all abilities and ages to enjoy the beautiful streamside setting.

Deep Creek is located between Creswick and Daylesford at Eganstown and is one of several natural springs in the area which attract visitors to explore the areas rich history.

According to connoisseurs each spring has its own unique taste and attract visitors for their supposed health and wellbeing benefits.
