DIVERSE MELBOURNE STORIES SET FOR THE BIG SCREEN

The Andrews Labor Government will help bring more stories of migrant life to the silver screen, backing local talent to create short films with a new development program.

The Labor Government will invest \$1.4 million over the next two years – for the *My Melbourne* screen initiative to be delivered in partnership with Indian Film Festival of Melbourne.

The program will support local South Asian screen talent to take a big career step, while creating short films based on diverse migrant experiences.

Each short film will showcase the talent of South Asian writers, actors and crew living and working in Melbourne and offer skills development opportunities for emerging screen industry workers.

Local talent will be mentored by high-profile Indian film directors Kabir Khan, Rima Das, Imtiaz Ali and Onir as they develop and produce their short films. The four short films will be released as a feature length anthology and will screen at next year's festival.

The Government backing will support film creators to showcase diverse stories addressing race, gender, sexuality and disability while also investing in the careers of up-and-coming on and off screen talent.

Supported through VicScreen, the Indian Film Festival of Melbourne is the largest annual celebration of Indian cinema outside of India. A program of over 100 films showcasing a wide range of genres, themes and voices opens in Melbourne today.

The four short films will commence production in Melbourne in the coming months, are set to premiere at the 2023 festival. For more information about My Melbourne, visit iffm.com.au.
