STRENGTHENING OUR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

The Andrews Labor Government is supporting Victorians in Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula through their mental health and drug and alcohol recovery journeys, opening a new centre to provide better access to the help they need, when they need it.

The \$1.5 million Tarnbuk Centre in Frankston brings together two of Peninsula Health's existing services - the mental health service and the alcohol and other drugs service – to get people the care they need, with a focus on support and recovery.

The new centre will not only improve continuity of care for clients but also provide a collaborative working environment for staff across both health sectors, delivering integrated, high-quality service and supports to individuals, families and the community.

With a focus on recovery, the Tarnbuk Centre is also offering new and expanded supports including a wellness clinic, dietetics, exercise physiology and music therapy – and will allow for future expanded treatment and recovery programs to meet demand.

The *Victorian Budget 2022/23* delivered more than \$1.3 billion to continue the work to reform the mental health system – building on last year's record investment of \$3.8 billion and ensuring work is underway on implementing more than 90 per cent of the Royal Commission's recommendations.
