## VICTORIA CELEBRATES WINNERS OF DISABILITY AWARDS

The outstanding achievements of Victorians with disability and those advocating to break down barriers for a fairer, more inclusive community have been honoured at the Victorian Disability Awards.

Minister for Disability, Ageing and Carers Colin Brooks congratulated the winners of the annual Victorian Disability Awards, which are now in their eleventh year and were announced yesterday at an online ceremony hosted by comedian Alistair Baldwin.

The awards showcase the positive impact made by people who work to improve accessibility, advocate for the rights of people with disability and build more inclusive workplaces and communities.

The 2022 Minister's Award for Outstanding Leadership was awarded to the Blind Sports and Recreation Victoria Volunteer Ambassadors, who improve access to sport and recreation at the local, state, national and international level and actively advocate for inclusion for people who are blind or have low vision.

The ambassadors, 13 committed volunteers with lived experience of being blind or having low vision, also won this year's Volunteer Award for their work in boosting participation and inclusion in sport.
