VICTORIAN KIDS CELEBRATE RIDE2SCHOOL DAY

Victorian families are joining kids across the nation in keeping healthy by getting active, with the national *Ride2School* day initiative encouraging students to get on their bikes to get to school.

Minister for Education Natalie Hutchins today joined local students at Ascot Vale Primary School to support the initiative, with Bicycle Network CEO Alison McCormack and North Melbourne Football Club AFL/W stars Ben McKay and Nicole Bresnahan highlighting the benefits of cycling to school.

Riding a bike is an easy and fun way to get to school and is a core focus of the Victorian Government's Active Schools initiative, which supports school communities to go beyond traditional physical education and sport to find opportunities for physical activity throughout the day.

The Andrews Labor Government launched the Active Schools, Active Kids, Active Communities initiative in November 2020, with \$24.6 million towards the Active Schools initiative to ensure students have the opportunity to develop the skills, knowledge, and behaviours that lead to healthy and active lives.

The *Victorian Budget 2022/23* included a further \$20.8 million over two years to continue the Active School initiative, bringing the total investment to \$45.4 million since 2019.

The Labor Government has invested a further \$1.4 million to continue the Ride2School program led by Bicycle Network Victoria, ensuring more kids are encouraged to stay active and healthy.

More than 203,280 students from more than 484 schools around Australia have registered to participate in *Ride2School* in 2023.
