ASIAN ELEPHANTS TO MAKE A SPLASH IN NEW MEGA POOLS

The Allan Labor Government is helping Melbourne's Asian elephant herd make an even bigger splash – delivering two mega pools at Werribee Open Range Zoo.

Minister for Environment Steve Dimopoulos today visited Melbourne Zoo to see three half-tonne calves – Aiyara, Kati and Roi-Yim – reach their latest developmental milestone and explore the zoo's 2.5-metre-deep pool.

At the Werribee Open Range Zoo, construction is underway to support two new Asian elephant mega pools as part of the Labor Government's \$88 million Werribee Open Range Zoo Expansion project.

The pools will reach a depth of 3.5 metres, and collectively hold two million litres of Class A recycled water – large enough to accommodate the growing herd of elephants and it will also help to improve their skincare, swimming ability and social skills.

The Werribee Open Range Zoo Expansion project will deliver a 21-hectare purpose-built Elephant Trail, new pedestrian pathways, improved amenities and landscapes for priority conservation species such as Asian Wild Horse and American Bison.

The expansion is the same size as the entire Melbourne Zoo, and the equivalent of five MCG stadiums – with the project also set to create more than 100 jobs.

The entire Asian elephant herd is expected to move to Werribee Open Range Zoo in 2024.
