DJILANG PLAZA TO HONOUR THOUSANDS OF YEARS OF GATHERING

Victorians will pay tribute to the connection to land and place of First Nations People in Geelong, with the new northern plaza at Kardinia Park's iconic redevelopment to be named Djilang Plaza, thanks to the Allan Labor Government.

Minister for Tourism, Sport and Major Events Steve Dimopoulos announced the plaza name, Djilang, would honour Traditional Owners of the land on which the venue sits and ensure the story of the land is told for generations to come.

Meaning a "Tongue of Land," Djilang is the Traditional Wadawurrung title for Geelong and represents the unique way Geelong and the Bellarine sits on the edge of the bay.

Kardinia Park has been a meeting place for Wadawurrung for thousands of years, with gatherings for all aspects of Traditional cultural ceremonies and rituals. With locals and visitors from interstate, Australia and globally set to enjoy this iconic new meeting place, Djilang Plaza will recognise the history of the region's First Peoples.

Facing onto Moorabool Street outside Gate 1 at the northern end of the stadium, Djilang Plaza will become a gateway to welcome thousands of spectators to the venue every year and will share stories of Wadawurrung.

Overseen by the Trust, the Stage 5 Redevelopment will deliver a new 14,000 capacity, two-tier northern stand, new northern entry plaza, sports museum, indoor cricket hub, function rooms and a suite of technology upgrades.

Patrons will enjoy world-class facilities all year round with the venue set to host a packed schedule of events of Australian Football, T20 cricket, football, concerts and many other community activities which makes Kardinia Park so important to Geelong and the entire region.

Led by the Kardinia Park Stadium Trust as the naming authority, the naming process involved significant consultation with the community and key stakeholders, including Wadawurrung Traditional Owners and Geographic Names Victoria.

Construction on the Stage 5 Redevelopment continues and once complete will increase the overall stadium capacity to 40,000 people.
