BE SAFE NOT SILLY THIS NEW YEAR'S EVE

Victorians are being urged to make safety a priority this New Year's Eve to ensure everyone can enjoy the occasion. The Allan Labor Government will be working closely with Victoria Police, emergency services and local councils to remind everyone to celebrate responsibly and ensure 2024 gets off to a safe start for everyone.

Minister for Police Anthony Carbines today joined City of Melbourne Lord Mayor Sally Capp AO, Victoria Police Acting Commander Craig Peel and emergency services organisations to announce the safety measures in place to protect Victorians during this festive time.

Melbourne's CBD is set to ring in 2024 with a fireworks and laser display – lighting up the city from across 27 CBD rooftops. With more than 400,000 people expected, New Year's Eve brings more people into the city at one time than any other event.

People are encouraged to view the fireworks from the four celebration zones located at Docklands, Flagstaff Gardens, Treasury Gardens and Kings Domain. These family-friendly areas will feature DJs, dance workshops and live entertainment, as well as local fireworks displays.

The New Year's Eve celebrations are supported by the \$200 million Melbourne City Revitalisation Fund – a partnership between the City of Melbourne and the Labor Government.

Victoria Police will be out in force across the state with uniform and plain clothes officers carrying out extra patrols throughout the night targeting anti social behaviour, violence, and drink and drug driving.

Security in the city will be supported by additional wardens and security guards monitoring behaviour as well as seven kilometres of fencing to manage crowds in key CBD areas.

There will be major changes to regular traffic and pedestrian access on the night to ensure crowds move around safely. People should plan ahead by checking the closures and detours at <u>nye.melbourne.vic.gov.au</u>.

Victoria Police will use specialist squads where needed including water police, mounted branch, public order response team and air wing.

Protective Services Officers (PSOs) will be on trams, trains and train stations around Melbourne CBD, and in key areas across the state including Geelong, Ballarat, Frankston, Bendigo and Traralgon.

Victoria Police will also have a strong presence on Victorian roads, targeting motorists who are drug and alcohol affected, speeding, driving dangerously, not wearing seatbelts, on their phones or otherwise distracted.

Mobile phone and seatbelt detection cameras are also out in force and can be deployed to up to 200 locations across Victoria.
