## NEW HOMES FOR PEOPLE WITH COMPLEX MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS

More people in Melbourne's south-east with complex mental health and wellbeing concerns will have access to safe and secure housing thanks to funding from the Allan Labor Government.

Minister for Housing Harriet Shing today visited a newly completed housing development in Pakenham that provides accommodation to people living with mental health conditions who need a home.

The development – which has 16 one-bedroom, self-contained units – is the result of a partnership between Homes Victoria, Haven Foundation and Mind Australia. Homes Victoria has committed more than \$2.8 million towards the project.

The homes will be allocated to people on the Victorian Housing Register living with significant and complex mental health concerns, including those who are homeless or escaping family violence.

The development has been designed to create a sense of community, as well as providing on-site overnight facilities for qualified and experienced around-the-clock support staff.

It's all part of the Labor Government's investment to meet the high demand for social and affordable housing options across Victoria and get more people into safe and secure homes.

In Shire of Cardinia, more than \$30 million has been invested under the Big Housing Build and other social housing programs to create 84 new homes.

Through the Big Housing Build, and commitments in the Housing Statement and Regional Housing Fund the Labor Government is transforming Victoria's housing landscape.
