FUNDING BOOST FOR NOOJEE TO EXPLORE NEW COMMUNITY HUB

The Allan Labor Government is supporting the Noojee community to take the next steps in diversifying the town's economy as part of the Forestry Transition Program.

Minister for Agriculture Ros Spence today announced \$510,000 for Baw Baw Shire Council that will help the town transition away from native timber harvesting, improve energy reliability in the region and investigate opportunities for a community hub and education center.

As part of this investment, \$20,000 will go towards exploring ways to improve power reliability and connectivity. The Shire will partner with Baw Baw Sustainability Network to capture data on energy usage, power sources, household waste and firewood collection to help understand the current and future needs for Noojee's power.

A working group will then use the data to explore a range of renewable energy technologies to provide greater energy reliability and security for the district.

The audit will be launched Sunday evening at an event held by the Shaping the Future of Noojee Local Development Strategy team and aims to engage with 100 households in Noojee and surrounding area.

A further \$80,000 will be used to fund a feasibility study for a multipurpose community hub and education center. The proposed hub could be used for a variety of functions including recreation, education and a place of safety during emergencies, with the intention of increasing the number of visitors to Noojee.

This investment also includes \$410,000 to continue the work on Noojee's Local Development Strategy (LDS) until 2026. The LDS program is designed to be community led and reflect local priorities and ambitions as communities transition away from native timber harvesting.

Noojee is one of 11 Victorian towns and communities receiving support to transition from the Government's Forestry Transition Program Community Development Fund. For more information visit vic.gov.au/forestry.
