INVESTING IN OUR LOCAL MANUFACTURERS TO REACH NEW HEIGHTS

The Allan Labor Government is helping manufacturers across Victoria expand operations and take their business to the next level – creating more local jobs while making Victoria's manufacturing sector more globally competitive.

Minister for Jobs and Industry Natalie Hutchins today announced the recipients of the Labor Government's *Made in Victoria – Manufacturing Growth Program*, with nine small and medium-sized Victorian manufacturers set to receive a grant of up to \$250,000 to take their manufacturing business from strength to strength.

The funding will make it easier for small and medium-sized manufactures to introduce new technologies and processes, improve productivity and competitiveness in local and global supply chains, upskill workers and create more highly-skilled jobs.

With the recipients based across Victoria and operating across a variety of sectors including food and beverage, construction, and packaging and transport, this program is helping secure a bright future for our local manufacturing sector.

Among the recipients is family-owned business Essential Flavours and Ingredients in Carrum Downs which will significantly upgrade its liquid manufacturing capabilities – helping the company grow its workforce by more than 40 per cent and expand its exports across the Asia Pacific.

The *Made in Victoria* – *Manufacturing Growth Program* is part of the Government's work to support the state's advanced manufacturers to innovate and grow production including the Government's \$20 million *Manufacturing and Industry Sovereignty Fund* and the *Industry R&D Infrastructure Fund*.

Victoria's \$33.5 billion manufacturing industry is a driving force of the state's economy, made up of over 23,000 businesses, supporting more than 260,000 jobs and exporting goods worth \$23.9 billion.
