IMPROVEMENTS TO TWO KEY ROUTES IN FRANKSTON

The Albanese and Allan Labor Governments have made travel through the heart of Frankston, in Melbourne's south, easier for pedestrians and drivers as works begin to improve two key routes.

Works are underway to upgrade safety and connectivity on Cranbourne Road and Beach Street with the installation of a new signalised pedestrian crossing, along with other safety improvements.

As part of these works, there will be a new signalised pedestrian crossing installed on the westbound lanes of Cranbourne Road near the intersection of Beach Street, and a raised pedestrian crossing with flashing lights on Beach Street.

The new crossing on Cranbourne Road will link to the existing crossing on the eastbound lanes via a footpath in the centre median, improving access to schools, shops, bus stops and other local amenities.

Forty km/h school speed zones will be introduced on Cranbourne Road and Beach Street.

The installation of electronic speed limit signs on Cranbourne Road and static speed limit signs on Beach Street will remind drivers of the low-speed environment during peak school hours.

There will also be improvements near the intersection to help create a safer environment including upgraded kerbs, pram ramps and more street lighting.

These works are now underway and are expected to be completed by mid-2026.

The \$3.79 million project is jointly funded by the Australian and Victorian governments under the Road Safety Program, with each government committing \$1.895 million.
